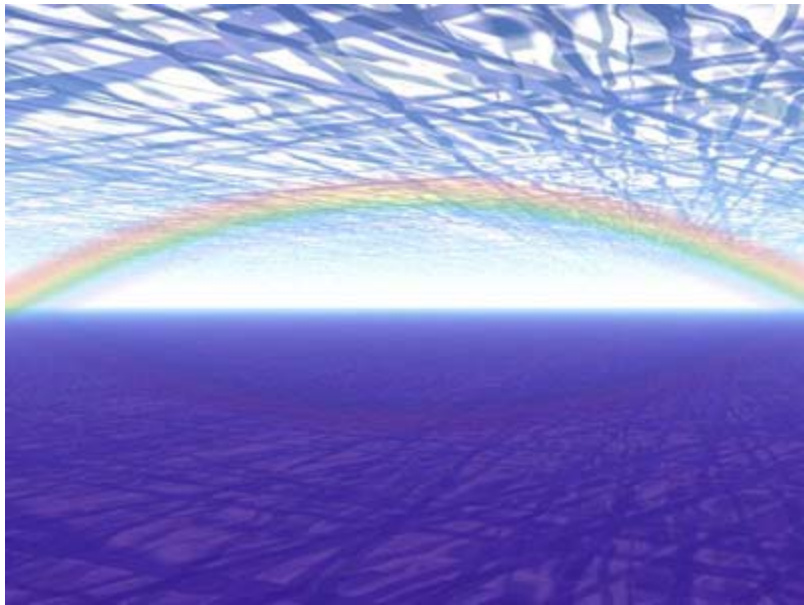
### Multiple Monitor Wallpaper and Screensavers

If you really want to snaz-up your new multi-monitor setup, get into multi-monitor graphics for your screen. They make the set even more impressive with matching monitor-mirror wallpapers for your screens. You can even create your own in a program like Photoshop or Printshop Pro or any photo editing application software. You just need to be aware of the screen and desktop dimensions for each of your specific multi-screen setups. Basically you need to scale the wallpaper to the desktop “resolution” screen sizes added together by the amount of screens that you have . An example would be, let’s say that you have 2, 17” monitors set at 800w x 600L screen resolution. You “add” the “2 “widths” of 800 x 2 = 1600w therefore your desktop wallpaper size for 2 monitors set at this resolution is 1600w X 600L. You can use the table below for reference on wallpaper sizes. What you are actually doing is making the wallpaper the same “Width” as the 2 monitor desktops added together. Think of it as one “very-wide” wallpaper.

- 2 monitors @ 800x600=1600x600
- 2 monitors @ 1024x768= 2048x768
- 2 monitors @ 1280x1024= 2560x1024
- 3 monitors @ 800x600=2400x600
- 3 monitors @ 1024x768=3072x768

The wallpaper for both monitors is setup through the “primary” monitor. Make sure that you select “**Tile**” as the “Position” in the Desktop display properties window. There is a small wallpaper collection which I have started to create in the folder “**mm\_Wallpapers**” which comes with this book. I will be adding more as time go’s on. They will be available through a download page on the Novastar Interactive website in the Multi-Monitor Easy Guide area. There are also some website links to sites which have multi-monitor wallpaper available. Look in the “**Website Resources**” to locate these websites.

In these website links there are also websites which have dedicated software available for multi-monitor wallpaper and screensaver slideshows. The screensaver slideshow are very nice to use as they cycle though a folder of images that you provide when the system is in screensaver mode. It displays the images randomly with internal transitions between each photo. Make sure that your slideshow images are the same size as your screen resolution ie: 800x600 or 1024x768. They do not have to be double width to accommodate both screens in this situation. Take a look at some of the multi-monitor wallpaper photo screen shots to see how really impressive they look together with multiple screens mirroring each other.







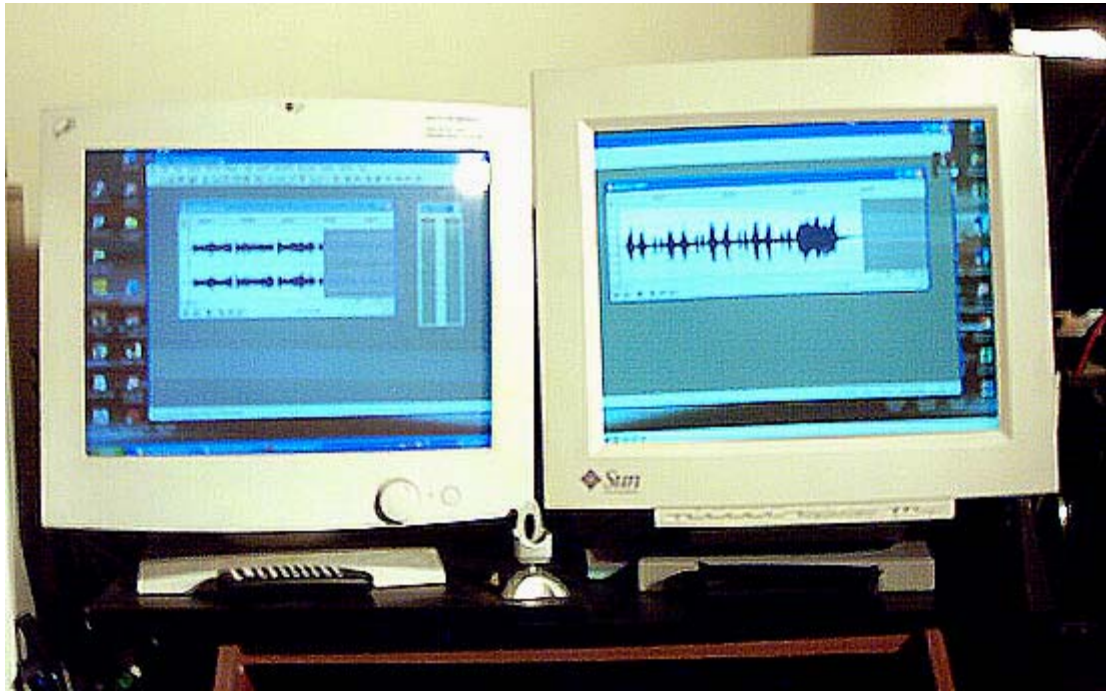
